


Regular Meeting Minutes of the City Council of the City of Cumby

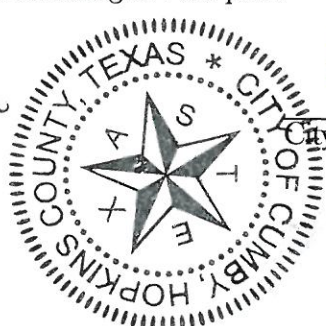



- I. Mayor Kathy Carter called the meeting order at 6:33 p.m.
Invocation And Pledge Of Allegiance
The invocation was given by Deidre Maples and the pledge was recited by the Mayor, Council and Citizens in attendance.
- II. Announcements - Mayor Carter announced that if anyone would like to assist the Food Pantry on Mondays, there was help needed to load food at Sulphur Springs to be brought back to Cumby. Also announced was that Mr. and Ms. Holley would be having their 50th anniversary on the 24th with a reception to be held on Saturday, June 25th from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the Brashear Baptist Church.
- III. No presentations by citizens.
- IV. Consent Agenda
Cody Talley moved to approve the consent agenda. Jackie Holley seconded, the motion passed 4-0.
- V. New Business
 - A) Cody Talley moved to approve resolution designating GrantWorks, Inc. as the consulting firm for the city and authorize them in grant programs. Jackie Holley seconded, the motion passed 4-0.
 - B) Cody Talley moved to have a preliminary budget prepared to be presented to Council at the July regular meeting. Robert Hines seconded, the motion passed 4-0.
- VII. Reports
 - A) Police Department
Paul Robertson reported activity for the police department for May as 335 traffic citations issued, 6 arrests, 8 warrants cleared by arrest, 1 site arrest, 6 traffic assists and 60 calls for service. Chief Robertson also reported the purchase of a police service dog the department which includes training for officer. This purchase is approximately \$15,000.00 with seized funds and the handler will be Brad Strawn. Training for the handler will be in Arkansas during July for two weeks.
 - B) Public Works
Johnny Carter reported that there were no leaks, park was cleaned up after Blackjack Grove Day, beginning repairs at the sewer plant, new paddlewheels and aerators need to be put on race track at the sewer plant. The system totals report submitted for May for the utility system showing water sold, gallons of water pumped and the water loss as 1.77 percent.
 - C) Fire Department
No report was submitted by the fire department.
