D) Doug Simmerman moved to approve Resolution 002-2015 casting vote for Barbara Stewart to the Hopkins County Appraisal Board of Directors. Cody Talley seconded, the motion passed 3-0.

VI. Reports

A) Police Department

Paul Robertson submitted a report with the activities by the police department for October as 313 traffic citations issued, 5 arrests, 1 drug offense, 1 resisting arrest and 3 warrant arrests.

B) Public Works

Johnny Carter reported the continued work with FEMA, large tree removed, paddle wheel repaired at treatment plant and replace gearbox and pulleys, water line put in for chlorine bottle at treatment plant, 2 sewer lines blown out, roads patched, prepared wells for winter and repaired 11 leaks. System totals report was submitted for the utility system showing water sold, gallons of water pumped and the loss for September as 6.53 percent.

C) Fire Department

Tommy Faulknor submitted a report with 7 medical calls, 7 motor vehicle accidents, 13 grass fires and 2 car fires with 9 in the city and 20 in the district.
