


Regular Meeting Minutes of the City Council of the City of Cumby



- I. Mayor Kathy Carter called the meeting order at 6:31 p.m.
Invocation And Pledge Of Allegiance
The invocation was given by Jackie Holley and the pledge was recited by the Mayor, Council and Citizens in attendance.
- II. Announcements

- III. Presentation By Citizens

- VI. Reports
A) Police Department

B) Public Works
Johnny Carter reported meter reading had been completed with 15 blank readings, 2 valves at sewer plant had to be plugged, 2 sewer lines blown out, water line repair, roads patched and the park had be setup for the holiday. System totals report was submitted for the utility system showing water sold, gallons of water pumped and the loss for November as 9.60 percent.
C) Fire Department
Tommy Faulknor submitted a report for November with 10 medical calls, 7 motor vehicle accidents, 1 grass fire, 1 car fire, 2 structure fires and 2 investigation/standbys with 10 in the city and 13 in the district.
